Am I Eligible to Get My Taxes Done for Free?

You may be eligible if:

- Your household income is about \$60,000 or less (some sites have lower income requirements-please clarify when making appointment)
- You do *NOT* have rental or real estate income, farm income, business expenses over \$5,000, or tips not reported on a W-2
- You are *NOT* a dual-status or non-resident alien of the United States

What Do I Need To Have My Taxes Done?

- Valid photo identification
- Copies of ALL W-2, 1098, 1099 Forms and the amount of other income received by you and your spouse, if filing jointly
 - ✓ If you are filing jointly with your spouse, BOTH spouses must be present in order to e-file the return (otherwise, you will have to paper file)
- Social Security numbers for you, your spouse, children, and/or all other individuals you will be claiming on your return
- Correct birth dates for you, your spouse and your children
- Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) for you and your spouse and any others shown on your tax return if you do not have a Social Security Number
- Form 8332 or a copy of divorce decree if you are a non-custodial parent claiming a child
- Account and routing transit number of your financial institution, if you would like to use direct deposit (bring a voided check for verification)
- Copy of your prior year's federal & state tax return, if available
- Child care provider's address and tax identification number (if using a licensed center)
- 2011 paid property tax receipts or paid rent receipts
- Expense records for charitable contributions, medical and dental expenses, business expenses, and/or contributions to retirement plans
