**Together,** we provide possibilities and life-changing services for local children, like Harrison, who has autism. Harrison, who is pictured on the cover, is a second-grader and participates in several United Way supported programs at Easterseals that help him with learning strategies for school and daily activities.

Speech-language and occupational therapy services have helped Harrison make progress towards his goals. He also attends a weekly Social-Skills Group to work on social and conversation skills.

Harrison is a bright, friendly child who shares an eagerness to attend therapy and often relays stories about his school, interests, and family with his therapists. One of his therapists, Theresa, notes "I am very proud to be a part of Harrison's story and help him meet his full potential. He is a hard worker and brings a lot of fun and energy to the sessions."

"We have seen so much progress with Harrison," says Jaime, his mother. "He now has immaculate handwriting, is able to open packaging that he couldn't before, and the programs have helped him with his social skills."
