

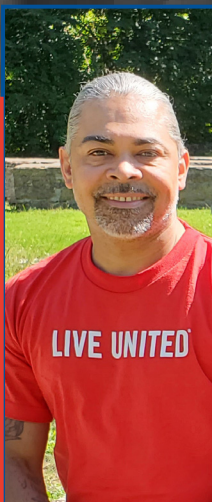

YOUR unwavering support is making a difference in the lives of 190,000 Berks Countians. This Annual Report celebrates accomplishments and progress YOU make possible, and highlights impact we have when we work together, like:

- **Investing in 80+ programs** to prepare children for school and academic success; to help individuals become employed through developed job skills; to empower families to reach financial stability; and to help our most vulnerable neighbors with basic needs.
- **Creating a dual impact for young students and teens** through Read Alliance, a program of our Ready.Set.READ! initiative. We partner with **Read Alliance** and **Reading School District** to deliver programming by pairing first graders with high school students to work on a phonics-based learning curriculum. The high school students learn valuable work habits, gain leadership skills, and some teens discover an aspiration to become an educator. - **Expanding access to fresh and healthy food for more children and families.** United Way collaborates with food banks, soup

kitchens, providers of shelter and housing and school districts to support children with meals through the **Weekender Program** and by addressing health concerns through **Veggie RX**. EXPANDING OUR IMPACT: POWERED BY PHILANTHROPIST MACKENZIE SCOTT

Continued innovation and impact were achieved through additional grant distribution from the \$10 million gift we received in 2020 from MacKenzie Scott.

EDUCATION

United Way is focused on kindergarten readiness, grade-level reading proficiency and preparing the workforce of tomorrow through the **Ready.Set.READ!** initiative.

Growing Readers (working with childcare centers to increase skills and retain Early Childhood Educators to improve kindergarten readiness), **Star Readers** (200+ trained tutors providing supplemental reading tutoring in 28 elementary schools) and **Read With Me** (family reading) programs.

In partnership with **Read Alliance and Reading School District**, high school students tutor first graders to measurably improve reading proficiency. The teen tutors gain valuable life and leadership skills through this paid work experience. In 2023/24, Read Alliance will be offered in two more elementary schools for a total of seven.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Investing in workforce development is a win-win-win for individuals, companies, and community. This past year, United Way supported several unique programs benefiting the local economy by increasing training and employment opportunities.

The **Reentry Works** program, managed by Berks Connections Pretrial Services, connects reentrants to employment through individualized plans focused on securing and retaining employment while working through barriers, like poverty, unstable housing, substance abuse disorders, and lack of support.

The **Berks Latino Workforce Development Corporation, or Berks Tec Centro**, serves individuals of diverse backgrounds who face barriers preventing them from qualifying for job openings, including the lack of the English language, academic skill and occupational skills. Graduates of the Certified Nursing and Phlebotomy programs are on the path to new careers.

Individuals with limited English speaking ability face significant barriers to employment. In partnership with **Reading Area Community College** and the **Literacy Council of Reading-Berks**, collaborations are in place with local manufacturing firms to help English Language Learner employees by providing customized ESL and numeracy classes.

HEALTH

The pandemic increased the mental and emotional struggles for youth in our community. A grant to **Berks Counseling Center** has provided the resources needed to establish an **Intensive Outpatient Program** to support more children through services that include health/wellness activities with family engagement in treatment.

The **LGBT Center of Greater Reading** understands the need to serve all people holistically which is why the organization received a grant to provide counseling and treat physical health, and food/hygiene needs.

A grant is expanding the **Veggie RX** program, delivered at Penn State Health St. Joe's, giving medical staff the resources needed to prescribe vouchers to patients for fresh produce; to support better health outcomes. The grant is also helping with the establishment of a more permanent, accessible urban **Healthy Food Store** for city residents with more affordable fresh and healthy food options.

CREATING RIPPLES OF CHANGE WITH THE HARWOOD INSTITUTE

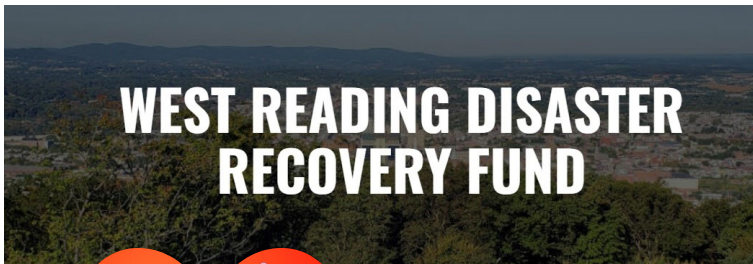
Real, lasting change occurs only when people and communities help lead the solution. United Way is working with community members to learn together, inspire each other, and take on shared challenges to act on three community-driven action items: early childhood education, English as a Second Language and after/out-of-school programs. During the past year, we facilitated a series of community conversations with residents to gain public knowledge, with a central philosophy of "doing with...not to". Teams are now planning action steps around community aspirations.



We learned from community conversations that city residents want more safe activities for their children and opportunities for more neighborhood connections. The Early Learning Education team hosted story time at 11th & Pike Playground and shared information with parents.

In March 2023, our community suffered a tragedy when an explosion occurred in West Reading. The immediate response of Berks Countians was to help.

The West Reading Borough enlisted the organizations they trusted to help...The Berks County Community Foundation and United Way. Together, the organizations established the West Reading Disaster Recovery Fund. The outpouring of support was incredible; more than \$1,000,000 has been donated by thousands of individuals, families and businesses across the county and country.

Families who lost loved ones working at R.M. Palmer Company at the time of the explosion and those living close to the explosion who lost their homes and possessions received disbursements from the fund, with the hopes to ease their burden as they cope with loss. The families have expressed gratitude for the kind generosity from the community during this difficult time.

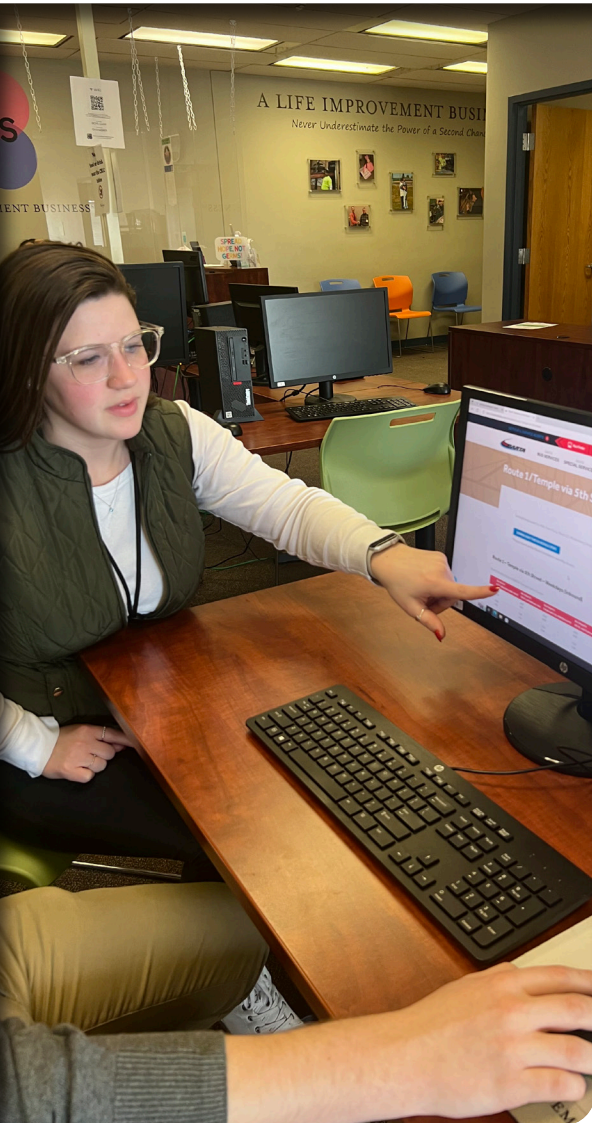

Ready.Set.READ!

Helps Pave the Way for School Success



The end of third grade is an important milestone, as up until that time, children are learning to read. By the beginning of fourth grade, students read to learn. That's why our Ready.Set.READ! initiative focuses on kindergarten readiness, reading proficiency by third grade and family engagement.

Here's how we are making a difference:

- **Star Readers** tutors work with first and second grade students in 20 elementary schools, within 12 school districts. More than 200 trained volunteer tutors were paired with 162 students this past school year.
- **Growing Readers:** Primarily Latino-owned childcare centers in the City of Reading receive coaching and mentoring services, along with curriculum support, to enhance literacy development for their students. A professional development program assists Early Childhood Educators (ECEs) in obtaining their Child Development Associate Credential (CDA) through a partnership with Reading Area Community College. In six cohorts, 59 ECEs have completed training provided in partnership with RACC, with 75% of them obtaining their Childhood Development Associate Credentials. In 2022, there were 146 children served by Growing Readers, resulting from professional development of the ECEs.
- **Read With Me** provides a book borrowing program to promote home book reading routines in five elementary schools and two childcare centers in a total of 40 classrooms.
- **Reach Out and Read** incorporates early literacy into pediatric practices, providing parents children's books to help prepare their children to learn and read. Nearly 700 books were distributed to partner pediatric practices to children, ages birth through five years old, at their annual checkup.

- We partner with **Read Alliance** and Reading School District to deliver programming three days a week, for fifteen weeks, by pairing first graders with high school students to work on a phonics-based learning curriculum. The high school students learn valuable work habits, gain leadership skills and some students discover an aspiration to become an educator. The first graders attain measurable progress in reading skills, with most students achieving a full year's growth after just one program cycle.

- **Neighborhood Bridges** is a comprehensive program of storytelling and creative drama that is curriculum-based and develops children's critical and cultural literacy, vocabulary, writing and communication skills. Institute for Arts Education delivers the program to all four of the third-grade classrooms at 16th & Haak Elementary School, Reading School District, as well as summer programming at 16th & Haak and 10th & Penn Elementary, Reading School District.

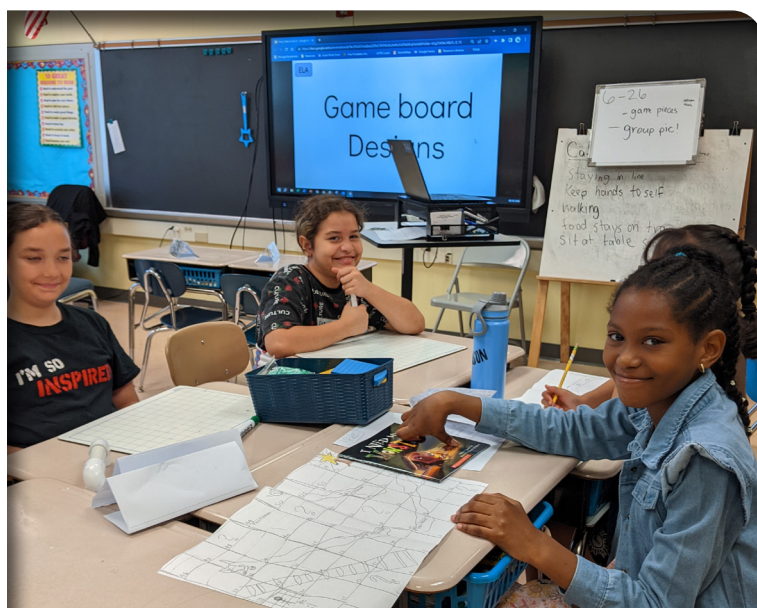


Summer Learning Grants 2022 Helping more than 1,000 local children

2022 Summer Learning Grants focus on boosting literacy and eliminating or minimizing the loss of learning over the summer. Grants were provided to summer programming for students up to and including third grade at our Ready.Set. READ! partner schools, Summer Learning Coalition and other organizations serving Berks County Title 1 students. These grants help boost literacy and lessen summer learning loss.

Oakbrook Collective Impact Council (OCIC)

2022 Highlights:

- Oakbrook Speaks Community Forum shared results from a community needs survey, conducted in partnership with Project REACH (Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health) and showcased how OCIC's work addressed barriers around issues of food insecurity, education, employment, transportation, safety and sense of community.
- Recognized United Way's role as the collaborative's anchor organization and OCIC's history of accomplishments: created summer learning programs focused on retaining or increasing reading skills, provided ESL programs for residents, and increased access to healthy and fresh food through a community garden and access to Helping Harvest's mobile market.
- As the collective work evolves, the efforts now transition to the Reading Housing Authority, as they established an Advisory Group to continue the work and create a neighborhood resource center and family services center.

Training, Engaging and Connecting Volunteers, Nonprofits and Companies

We make good things happen in Berks with these programs:

Blueprint for Leadership prepares individuals from underrepresented groups for community leadership roles through a 7-week program, meeting one day a week. A recent graduation celebrated 13 individuals completing the program.

We are growing the next generation of leaders (ages 21-45) through **Emerging Leaders United (ELU)**. We connect ELU members to volunteerism and philanthropy -- offering many volunteer opportunities throughout the year, along with a mix of personal/professional development and networking activities.

Leadership Berks trains and develops individuals to serve in nonprofit leadership roles through a 9-month, curriculum-based and experiential program with participants meeting once a month. The cornerstones of the program are placement of all participants onto local agency boards and committees and service projects completed to assist nonprofits. The 2022-23 Leadership Berks class completed projects benefitting: Big Brothers Big Sisters of Berks County, New Journey Community Outreach, Reading Area Firefighters Museum, Reading Science Center, VOICEup and Western Berks Free Medical Clinic. The 2023 class graduated 29 individuals. Classes kick off every September.

United Way's **Volunteer Center** connects individuals, families and employee teams with volunteer activities year-round with community-based organizations. The Volunteer Center coordinates United Way's signature annual events, like Big Cheese and Day of Caring, as well as recruits volunteer tutors for Ready.Set.READ! It also publishes the annual Summer Youth Volunteer Guide and a Holiday Volunteer Guide.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2022

The financial results presented are taken from United Way of Berks County's IRS Form 990 using the December 31, 2022 Audited Financial Statements.

The 2022 Audited Financial Statements contain an unmodified opinion, which is the highest opinion an organization may receive. United Way's complete audited financial statements and tax filing (IRS Form 990) may be obtained from the United Way of Berks County's website (www.uwberks.org) or by contacting the United Way office.

In 2022, United Way implemented the Lease Accounting Standard (Topic 842) issued by FASB. Under the guidance, operating leases are recorded on the Balance Sheet as a Right To Use Asset and as a Lease Liability. United Way has one operating lease, which is rent.

In 2020, the organization received an unrestricted gift of \$10MM. As United Way utilizes this gift in current year expenses for grants and other community impact work, there is no offsetting revenue, thus creating a deficit of revenue over expense.

The organization experienced significant market losses on investments during the fiscal year.

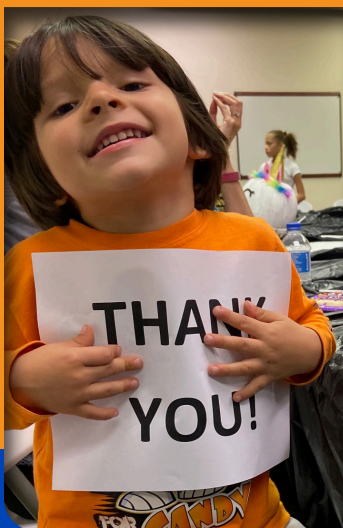
