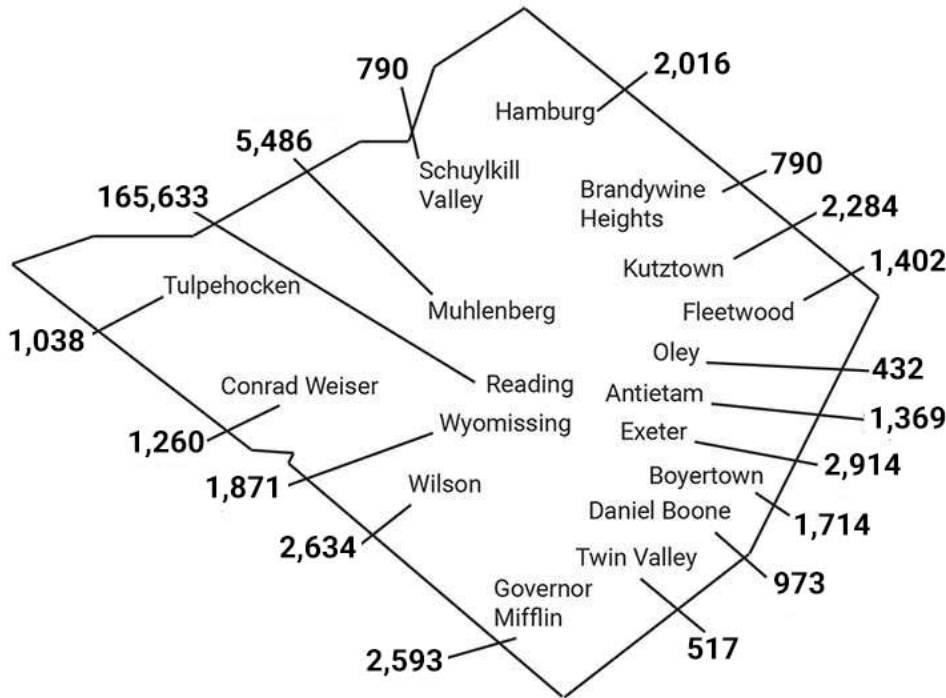


BERKS COUNTIANS SERVED IN 2023

Last year, more than 190,000 people in Berks County received services and support through United Way of Berks County.



United Way of Berks County helps more than 190,000 people throughout our community each year. The totals below are reported to United Way of Berks County by our agency/community partners and reflect our total investment in 2023 funded programs, initiatives and grants. It is possible that one person using multiple services may be reported as a beneficiary more than once. 2,591 individuals were reported as transient/homeless and are not included in the map.

REAL PEOPLE, REAL ISSUES



The numbers on the service map represent real people - individuals and families who need a little extra support, like Harrison:

Harrison, a second grade student, is thriving with the help of Easterseals programs. The United Way Agency

Partner provides support and therapies designed for the needs of children with autism. Harrison's parents enrolled him in the agency's Early Intervention program, and he began outpatient therapy just before starting kindergarten. He has made significant progress in both therapy sessions and social skills group, and his family receives comprehensive support through Intensive Behavioral Health Services. Harrison is eager to attend therapy each week, and his mother is delighted with his progress and the compassionate care provided by Easterseals.
