## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Program launch: April 8, 2026

- Participants meet at six morning workshops, one per week for 5 hours, April – May, at varied nonprofit and business sites
- Participants are linked to a mentor, representing a senior leader within the sponsoring organization, or BFL alumni, for coaching and support during the program
- Program Graduation: June 8, 2026
- Class topics include: Dale Carnegie public speaking, roles and responsibilities of board members, strategic leadership and nonprofit governance. Classroom and panel instruction includes community guest speakers, team-building experiences, and self-evaluation
