The place we call home is far more than a building, it's where we feel most safe.

But for some youth in our community, the concept of home has always seemed distant.

In 2023, 16-year-old twins, Dreylin and Demeechy turned to their school counselor after their father's alcoholism made it unsafe to return home.

Through support from United Way of Berks County and opportunities made possible by generous donors like you, Mary's Shelter offered the brothers housing, education, and social services.

Soon, they were able to experience many of life's "firsts" like going to the movies, cheering on sports teams, and cooking.

But for the brothers, the most important thing was home.

"It was my first time in a place that's safe with friends and people who care. They help me when I need it and are always just 'there' for us," Dreylin shares.

As high school graduates, they have big dreams and now plan to attend college.

Their journey from homeless teens to high school graduates is just one brief snapshot of the power of our community when we come together to support the next generation.
